Raffle: The pot was up to \$241, **Glenda Sales** had the winning ticket, but no luck finding the elusive green marble, so the pot will roll over to next week.



Program: **Brian Ling** introduced Jon Stout, General Manager of the Sonoma County Airport, who provided an update on the airport. With the arrival of Horizon in March, 2007, the airport has had 805,000 passengers, some 22 million pounds of baggage, had a \$112 million dollar economic impact and provided 414 jobs. The airport's 2015-16 projections indicate \$282 million economic impact, and 893 jobs. The airport's long-range plan calls for 21 flights a day by 2030. The number of passengers boarding commercial flights would grow from about 88,000 a year to nearly 300,000.



The airport is in talks with several carriers about new flights. Service depends on extending the airport's two runways, which are too short for regional jets. Horizon, the airport's only scheduled carrier, doesn't need longer runways because it uses turboprop aircraft. But other airlines use regional jets that require more room to take off and land.

Longer runways are part of a proposed \$84 million airport expansion which also calls for a new passenger terminal, relocated air traffic control tower, air cargo facility, runway buffer and safety zones, and other smaller projects.

Under the expansion plan, the airport's main runway would grow by 885 feet to 6,000 feet. The second runway would be extended to 5,202 feet. The current runways don't meet federal safety standards because they end at a common point on the airport's northern approach. That configuration could result in a pilot choosing the wrong runway in bad weather. As part of the expansion, the runways would be "decoupled" to meet federal standards.

The EIR is currently undergoing review by local and County officials.

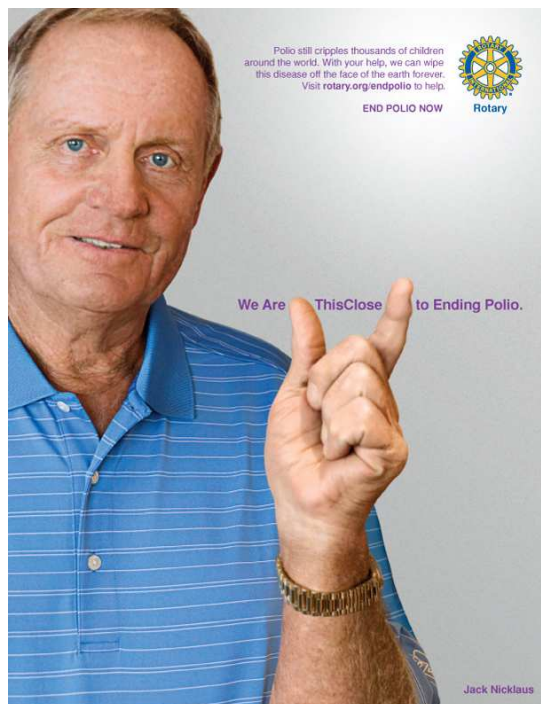
