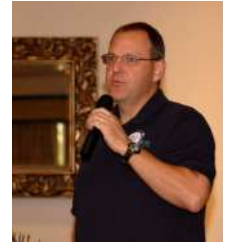

### Sandie’s Satellite Club Update



**Wally Krutz** ran the meeting this noon and **DG Maureen Merrill** spoke about--guess what?!--Rotary!! She began with a brief description of the large picture--RI and then

narrowed it to the District and then to the local club. It was a great informational presentation and different than the John Blount presentation and the Avenues of Service presentation that each of us did last week.



**Raffle:** The pot was up to \$77 and **Janet Rogers** had the winning ticket, but no luck finding the green marble.

**Program:** **Susan Cole** introduced Nick Frey, President of the Sonoma County Winegrape Commission, a position he has held for the last five years. He came to Sonoma County from Des Moines, IA, where he worked for the world’s largest seed company.



Nick represents the Sonoma County wine grape industry across the United States, putting on events like “Sonoma in the City”.

The SCWC was established in 2006 as a non-profit marketing and educational organization dedicated to the promotion and preservation of Sonoma County as one of the world’s premier grape growing regions. With more than 1,800 growers, and 623 wine producers, SCWC’s goal is to increase awareness and recognition of the quality and diversity of Sonoma County’s grapes and wines through dynamic marketing and educational programs targeted to wine consumers around the world. To that end, Nick works with growers and vintners to sell their product and feels that collaboration is the key to marketing and increasing tourism. Conjunctive labeling is coming which will carry an AVA designation to further identify Sonoma County wines.

Although the 2010 crop was below average, with tonnage off 5%, the 2011 crop has had good weather. The harvest is on, but late, with a small crop some 20-30% off from last year. Although yields are low, sales are up, with sauvignon in short supply. Nick suggests if you find a wine you like, buy a case or two.



After his presentation, Nick graciously signed a book plate for one of our dictionaries.
