## Coming This Week ...

### Sonoma County **BEST** *Building Economic Success Together*

Sonoma County **BEST**, *Building Economic Success Together*, is a five-year strategic plan for job creation and prosperity to directly address our economic challenges. For the first time in Sonoma County's history, a bold new approach to community and economic development is underway. A collaborative partnership between the private and public sectors is being forged. Sonoma County businesses and their leaders are joining forces with the local government to create jobs and economic vitality.

Fully-implemented over a five-year period, this \$3.25 million dollar program is projected to generate: 4,100 jobs, \$155 million in consumer expenditures, \$37 million in state & local tax revenues, and \$87 million in bank deposits.

Santa Rosa Chamber President Jonathan Coe will be presenting the Sonoma County BEST program Tuesday morning.

# Message from the Trustee Chair

## October, 2011



### An exciting month for the Foundation

October is a busy month for The Rotary Foundation. While our Trustees meeting is usually held in October, this year, because the 2012 RI Convention is so early in May, it was moved to September. This meant that “Taiwan Day” was also held earlier.

On Taiwan Day, we inducted Rotarians from Taiwan into the Arch C. Klumph Society in honor of their contributions of at least US\$250,000 to our Foundation. We inducted five generous couples on Taiwan Day in 2009, seven in 2010, and as I write we’ve had eight in 2011. When you consider the population of Taiwan and the number of Rotarians there, this giving is humbling. We now have over 300 Arch C. Klumph Society members, with the highest number in the United States, and now the second highest in Taiwan. A challenge to the rest of us!

October is a month with many Rotary institutes, where current, future, and past Rotary leaders come together to discuss what is happening within Rotary. We have a trustee and Foundation staff at each institute.

Each October, we also select the next group of our Rotary Peace Fellows – up to 60 for the two-year master’s, and up to 50 for the three-month certificate. The selection process is fascinating and resembles the draft system used by U.S. football teams to select their new players. All the applicants are scored and ranked by experienced Rotarians and the universities. Representatives from the universities come to the meeting with their “wish list” but take turns in choosing their actual scholars. Their choices may be influenced by a desire to have a wide geographical or subject spread, and sometimes they will “trade” choices. The result is that the best candidates become our fellows, and our program remains among the best.

**Polio this week**

**As of Wednesday, October 12, 2011**

A new case (wild poliovirus type 1 - WPV1) was reported from Central African Republic (CAR), the first in the country since August 2009. In Pakistan, eleven new cases are reported this week. The country now accounts for exactly one-quarter of all cases worldwide in 2011. Over 50% of all cases worldwide in 2011 are from two countries: Pakistan and Chad.

## October is Vocational Service Month

October is Vocational Service Month, a time when clubs highlight the importance of the business and professional life of each Rotarian and emphasize the Rotary practice of high ethical standards.





**Program:** Vocational Service Chair Leslie Lewis opened her presentation of Rotary's Four-Way Test by asking the question: Is it still relevant today?

More than 60 years ago, in the midst of the Great Depression, a U.S. Rotarian devised a simple, four-part ethical guideline that helped him rescue a beleaguered business. Herbert J. Taylor, author of the Test, was asked in 1932 to help revive the near-bankrupt Club Aluminum Company of Chicago. The cookware manufacturing company owed \$400,000 more than its total assets and was barely staying afloat. Herb responded to the challenge and decided to cast his lot with this troubled firm, taking an 80 percent pay cut to become president of Club Aluminum. He even invested \$6,100 of his own money in the company to give it some operating capital.

Looking for a way to resuscitate the company and caught in the Depression's doldrums, Herb, deeply religious, prayed for inspiration to craft a short measuring stick of ethics for the staff to use. And so, "The Four-Way Test of the things we think, say or do" was born:

1. Is it the TRUTH?
2. Is it FAIR to all Concerned?
3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?

Profound in its simplicity, the Test gradually became a guide for every aspect of the business, creating a climate of trust and goodwill among dealers, customers and employees. By 1937, Club Aluminum's indebtedness was paid off and during the next 15 years, the firm distributed more than \$1 million in dividends to its stockholders. Its net worth climbed to more than \$2 million.

In January 1943 the RI Board adopted and made The Four-Way Test a component of the Vocational Service program, although today it is considered a vital element in all four Avenues of Service. Herb Taylor transferred the copyright to Rotary International when he served as R.I. president in 1954-55.

Today, more than six decades since its creation, has the Test lost its usefulness in modern society, as some critics maintain? Is it sophisticated enough to guide business and professional men and women in these fast-paced times?

Is it the TRUTH? There is a timelessness in truth that is unchangeable. Truth cannot exist without justice.

Is it FAIR to all concerned? The substitution of fairness for the harsh principles of doing business at arm's length has improved rather than hurt business relationships.

Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS? Man is by nature a cooperative creature and it is his natural instinct to express love.

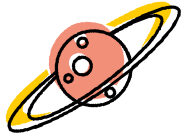
Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned? This question eliminates the dog-eat-dog principle of ruthless competition and substitutes the idea of constructive and creative competition.

The Four-Way Test is international, transcending national boundaries and language barriers. It knows no politics, dogma or creed. More than a code of ethics, it has all the ingredients for a successful life in every way. It can and will work in today's society.
