

## Club Directed Awards

---

Rotary International provides the club presidents several opportunities to recognize their members for outstanding service. The purpose of this note is to provide club presidents with a list of such awards in hopes that they will take advantage of these awards programs. ### **EACH ONE, REACH ONE AWARD**

Nominator: Club Presidents

This award allows Rotary club presidents to nominate and recognize individuals for sponsoring new members while focusing on retention. There are several categories:

Gold: 25 new members with 20 still active after six years.

Silver: 10 new members with 8 still active after four years.

Bronze: 5 new members with 4 still active after two years.

### **FAMILY AND COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD (for Individuals or Organizations)**

Nominator: Club Presidents

This award is a certificate that Rotary clubs may confer on individuals or organizations for outstanding service to families and communities, or in recognition of the positive contributions to individual Rotary clubs made by spouses or family members of Rotarians. It is a good way for clubs to celebrate Family Month in December, recognize members of the family of Rotary, and promote Rotary in the community. Certificates are available for sale in lots of 10.

### **AVENUES OF SERVICE CITATION (for Rotarians)**

Nominator: Club Presidents

This citation program provides a way for Rotary clubs to personally recognize one club member for his or her outstanding efforts in the five Avenues of Service. Download the nomination form.

### **INTERNATIONAL SERVICE AWARD FOR A POLIO-FREE WORLD (for Rotarians)**

Nominator: Any Rotarian

Deadline: November 1.

This award was established by the Trustees of The Rotary Foundation to recognize outstanding contributions to the polio eradication effort and to encourage participation in the final eradication work. Download nomination form.

# Non Rotary Awards:

Club presidents also have the ability to recognize members with non Rotary awards. The most notable of these awards is the Cliff Dochterman Award.

## **THE CLIFF DOCHTERMAN AWARD**

This award is presented to an individual Rotarian who has displayed distinguished service to the program of scouting. Clubs should be encouraged to submit club members who have scouting affiliations. Go to Google search and type in Cliff Dochterman Award to obtain the nomination form.

## **CITY AND COUNTY AWARDS**

Club presidents are encouraged to check with their local officials for the opportunity to nominate Rotarians for available community awards.

# District Awards
