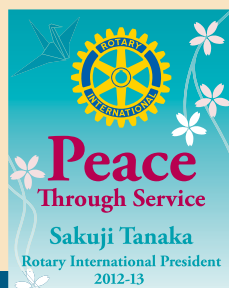

Danny Heinsohn

Inspirational Journey From a Cancer Survivor



A career in sports business was an unlikely path after graduating with a degree in Electrical Engineering in 1999. However, after a brain cancer diagnosis Danny Heinsohn was forced to play the game of life by a different set of rules. He endured 3 craniotomies, where a tumor the size of a racquetball was removed from his skull. He survived a code blue, an entire year of chemo, and began to battle through two years of depression.

While Danny grew up playing baseball, basketball, and tennis, he found salvation through endurance sports after chemo. Soon, salvation turned to passion, and passion turned to success. Over the years Danny has raised over \$125,000 for the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society through training for marathons, coaching a cycling team, and competing in several triathlons.

Danny's resilience soon began to shine through his professional career at Access Pass & Design, founded in 2002 and based in Sparks, NV. The company began its primary business through designing and manufacturing backstage passes for the concert touring industry. With no sales or marketing background when

he began, Danny found a way to bring aboard the biggest names in sports and corporate brands. You name it – The New York Yankees, Baltimore Ravens, Boston Bruins, SEC, Nevada Wolf Pack, San Francisco Giants, Red Bull, MillerCoors, Nike, Google, Texas A&M Aggies, the list goes on.

In 2010 he celebrated his 10th year of brain cancer remission by founding a scholarship fund for young cancer survivors called My Hometown Heroes, and competed in Ironman Canada. An Ironman triathlon is the ultimate endurance event which starts with a 2.4 mile swim, followed by a 112 mile bike, and concludes with a 26.2 mile run, with just 17 hours to finish. In a field of over 3000 athletes from over 50 countries and 45 US States, Danny finished among the top third and clocked the fastest time for his home state of Nevada with a time of 11h 57m 24s.

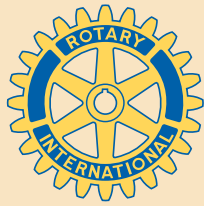
Danny was 23 years old when he was diagnosed. He is now 37. With the release of his book later this spring and inspirational speaking engagements, Danny wishes to raise over \$1 million dollars to financially assist young cancer survivors who wish to pursue a college education, and help fund health education programs in need, by the time he's 40.

- President Elect session - What is expected and what you should be doing

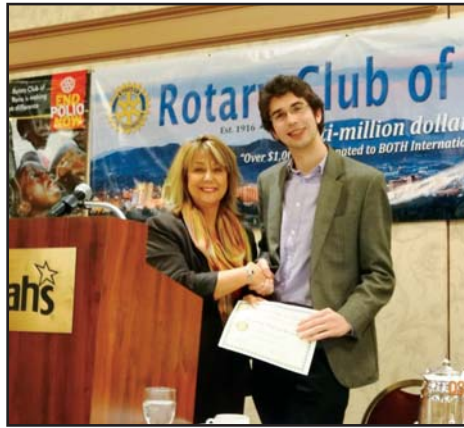
- President Nominee (2014-2015) - Now that you are in leadership – What next?

How To Introduce Your Guests And New Members At A Club Meeting

When introducing a guest or new members during a Club meeting, the correct way is to greet the Club President, fellow Rotarians and guests, introduce yourself and state your classification, and then introduce your guest, their title and business affiliation. **Please do not introduce any guest as a prospective new member or that they are looking for a position or clients.**

Attendance And Make Up Reminder

Your attendance is important to both you as a member and to the Club in meeting attendance percentage requirements. Please make sure you turn in make-ups to our Club Secretary at a club meeting or by email. Don't forget that you need to attend or make up at least 50% of club regular meetings in each half of the year (rolling six months) and attend at least 30% of this club's meetings in each half of the year.
