Oscar Lehto new youth exchange student, coming from Pori, Finland

Oscar Lehto, 17, is our club's youth exchange student for 2014-15. He is from Pori, a city with a population of nearly

84,000 on the west coast of Finland. It is 11th largest city in Finland, and the seventh largest urban area.

He has studied English for eight years; Swedish and Finnish for 11 years. He has just completed grade 10 and expects to graduate in May 2016.

During the last school year his courses included extended mathematics, extended physics, and extended languages (Finnish, Swedish, German and English).

Other courses have included biology, philosophy, geography, history, religion, healthcare, and chemistry. All subjects have at least one mandatory course.

The youngest of four children, he has three sisters, ranging in age from 22 to 27. His father, Esa Matti Lehto, a member of the Rotary Club of Kuninkaankartano in Pori, has worked for the last 25 years in the international pharmaceutical industry. He is employed as an associate clinical trial manager for ICON Clinical Research. His mother, Izabela Koszek-Lehto, works for Tupperware as a team leader. Both parents have their offices at home.

Oscar is interested in politics and was chosen to his city's youth parliament. He is active in social media and forums where he chats with people with similar interests to his own.

His additional activities are music and sports. Oscar has played piano since he was seven years old, and plays mostly at school and at home. He practiced handball with a team called IF Helsinge Atlas since the first grade, but switched to basketball three years ago after his family moved from Helsinki to Pori because there is no handball team in Pori.

He plays basketball on a local team called BC Sisu. He practices with the team for boys 15 to 17 and with the men's

team. Oscar goes to gym four to six times a week and to basketball practice twice a week. He is also an assistant coach for a basketball team for boys 11 to 12.

Pori is known for its local ice hockey team which is called Porin Assat (in English, Pori Aces). Assat last won the Finnish championship in 2012-2013; previous championships years were 1978, 1971, 1967 and 1965. Oscar goes quite often to see the games with his father.

He has traveled outside of Finland many times. His family has a summer cottage in Poland. He has also been in Germany several times, because all of his sisters have been there as exchange students. He has visited Sweden with his father many times, and has been in Denmark and the Czech Republic in tournaments with his handball team.

After high school Oscar would like to study political science at Abo Akademi University in Turku, Finland. After graduating from the university, he plans to go to the Police Academy in Tampere to become detective chief inspector.

His number one goal as an exchange student is to work on his English language skills. He is also curious about the American culture. He would like to join a local basketball or handball team to meet new people and to keep up his skills.

"All his life, Oscar has seen us accommodating foreign short term exchange students," his father wrote in his son's youth exchange application. "During the two past years we have accommodated Rotary exchange students and (also) young adult group exchange students from Australia and from the U.S." It was after a discussion Oscar had this spring with a exchange student from Los Angeles that he decided he would apply for the long-term Rotary program.

Foundation changes Carl Dryer Award certificate procedure; names new officers

Because of the increasing cost of framed certificates to recognize new Carl Dryer Award recipients, the trustees of the Lakewood-Rocky River Rotary Foundation have voted to eliminate framed certificates earned after June 30, 2016.

In recent years, many recipients have stated that they would have preferred to not receive a framed certificate, and instead have the money the spent on the certificate remain in the Foundation's treasury.

Anyone completing his/her first Carl Dryer Award by June 30, 2016 will have the option of receiving a framed certificate. After June 30, 2016, anyone completing his/her first Carl Dryer Award will receive an unframed paper certificate. In all cases, Carl Dryer recipients will be recognized with a name plate on the wall plaque outside the club meeting room at the Umerley Civic Center.

In other business, for Rotary year 2014-15, Bill Huffman will be the Foundation's president; Jim Lechko, vice president; Jon Fancher, secretary; and Tom English, treasurer. Matt Daugherty will chair the investment committee, replacing Jim Lechko. All other committee chairs will continue from 2013-14.

Pam Gallagher-Vine was chosen to serve the balance of Don McQuilkin's term on the Board, ending June 30, 2017.

The Foundation's annual meeting will be September 29 at Umerley Civic Center and will be the program for the club's regular noon meeting.


