What is the Living Memorial Rotary Tree Park?

It is a non-profit tree planting charitable program operated by the Rotary Club of Burlington Central in co-operation with the City of Burlington. By dedicating memorial trees to departed loved ones, you are creating a permanent, growing tribute that lives on, while contributing to the greening of Burlington's parks.

The tree planting program began in 1995 in Central Park, on Guelph Line behind the Rotary Youth Centre. Since then, so many trees have been planted that a new site has been created at Maple Park on Maple Avenue.

How do I donate?

Individuals make a donation in the amount of \$500.00 to the Living Memorial Rotary Tree Park, in care of the Rotary Club of Burlington Central. Payment can be made by cheque or VISA by sending in the mailer section of this brochure. Applications may also be forwarded individually or from a group through any funeral home that supports the greening of Burlington.

How is my donation recognized?

A card will be given to the family acknowledging your donation in memory of your loved one. All memorial names will be placed in our Living Memorial Tribute Book and erected on a plaque in front of the Tree Park. A smaller recognition plaque will be fastened to your tree.

Each contributor will receive a tax receipt and a thank you letter from the Living Memorial Rotary Tree Park committee, specifying the species of tree that has been planted, and a guide to its location. The Tree Park is open at any time for visitation.

A tree symbolizes strength, durability, shelter and beauty.
