

### **Suggested Activities for the Community Service Zone 32 Award**

- Conduct a community needs assessment and use it to establish new local service projects that will involve at least half of the club members and their spouses and children.
- Conduct a community service project carried out by club members along with an Interact or Rotaract club.
- Work with a neighborhood association or city/town parks department on a clean up and/or improvement project.
- Sponsor or participate in a health awareness campaign or a project that addresses health concerns.
- Start a “Healthy Eating” program at the local food pantry. Bring in area chef’s that can demonstrate and share recipes.
- Provide sponsors and programs for school programs that have been affected by budget cuts such as art.
- Sponsor or participate in a project that addresses child safety such as road or playground safety.
- Sponsor or participate in a project that addresses the problems of child abuse.
- Sponsor a new Rotaract or Interact Club.
- Sponsor participants in a Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) event.
- Have a Rotary World Peace Fellow speak at a club meeting.
- Have a current or recent GSE team member speak at a club meeting.
- Share your Rotary activities with your local community by publicizing them.
