1. Establish and send realistic goals to your District Governor for

- a. Membership
- b. Annual program giving
- c. Polio contribution

2. District Sponsored seminar attendance

- a. PETS
- b. Assembly
- c. Regional President meetings (75% attendance)
- d. Foundation, Membership, and PR workshop participation

3. Club must send at least two candidates to RLI

4. Club must send at least two local students to RYLA

5. Club leadership plan must be worked by officers and interested club members

6. Two or more members must attend the District Conference

7. At least three district committee chairs/members must be invited to speak at the club

8. No more than five club meetings without a program – a guest speaker

9. At least one local service project to support one of the areas of focus for our Foundation

10. Be a visiting Rotarian at two clubs during your year as club president.

11. Club participation with an international (global) grant.

12. One or more local fund raising programs with member participation (beat the 80-20 rule)!!
