## Wonderful Club Visits

## National Membership Conference - July

A stimulating weekend in cold Canberra greeted 600 delegates from every Australian District who gathered to contribute ideas to shape our path ahead. Membership was the principal focus, because it has been recognised that, to satisfy community demands and international objectives, every club needs to increase their membership base with quality people.

We listened to RI President DK Lee urge us to fulfil 'his dream' of markedly reducing child mortality. Rotary International's goal of eliminating Polio remains dominant.

Then, because RI predicates its world success on providing club autonomy, we all

moved to breakout discussion groups, to share methods, plans and successes in achieving growth. Every group had a facilitator and nominated a note taker and these notes will be consolidated and distributed to district Chairs and other delegates. Clubs will be given these at our joint Dist Membership Seminar, to be held in August, under PP Kelly Wagner's chairmanship (Adelaide EDGE).

In addition, the National Marketing Team, headed by PDG Dick Garner, heralded a new website: [www.membership.rotary.org.au](http://www.membership.rotary.org.au) and an umbrella committee to introduce and recommend national marketing action to promote Rotary in Australia. This program is a 'work in progress' due to the positive actions from IPDG Kerry Brandt-Wilson and ten other District Governors who, at this time last year, sent development funds.

With support from all 23 Districts likely this year, we can expect TV and radio commercials to spread awareness of Rotary's generous activities. This will lead to increased awareness and more positive attitudes for Clubs attending to membership growth.

Club growth initiatives and targets will be more easily reached when branding and awareness in the general community is lifted.

## History Corner

What a thrill I had, when I recently received a copy of "The Fifth Ten Years: Part 1 – the First Five" from the Rotary Club of Henley Beach. This is a continuation of the history project this club started many years ago, when they printed a history of the first ten years of the club. Now they have recorded the history of the club's 45 years, and in five years time will complete the 50 years and have a ready record available when celebrating their Golden Jubilee. For those interested, the RC of Henley Beach was chartered 27 March 1963. Congratulations to the Editor and team for maintaining the recording of the club's history.

Over the years some clubs have published what I have called "Mini

Histories" centred on a particular activity. I recall one such publication that gave the history of the club's involvement in the Youth Exchange programme, outlining both those who went overseas and those who were hosted from overseas. The small well-illustrated booklet of about 10 pages was a wonderful addition to the club's historical record.

Other such booklets have dealt with themes such as the actual weekly club meeting, focussing on sub-topics such as guest speakers, locality, cost, Sergeants and special occasion meetings. Probably the most frequent "Mini-Histories" centre around the President. These are but a few suggestions, but I am sure that there are many more possibilities, for particular clubs have developed projects of a local community nature

and which have been conducted for a number of years e.g. The "Henley on Todd" Regatta.

In this early part of a Rotary year, all clubs should check to see if there are any Club anniversaries, such as 500<sup>th</sup> meeting or a major year anniversary (eg 10 years). If so, start planning early, as these can be great for Club morale and fellowship.

From my reading I came across the following definition of an Historian written by Count Leo Tolstoy (1328-1910) a Russian writer:-

"Historians are like deaf people who go on answering questions that no one has asked them".

Bichai Rattakul is a past World President of Rotary International (2002/03) and Chair of The Rotary Foundation (till 2007) who has reached a level of reverence from a vast army of admirers which approaches that given to Saints. He spoke to the International Assembly in San Diego last January and, as so often happens when he speaks, the audience became mesmerised in his message, delivery, and wisdom.

## 2010 Council on Legislation

Every three years the Rotary International (RI) Council on Legislation meets to consider changes to the Constitution, By Laws and Policies of RI. It is the legislative body or "parliament" of RI, that is, it "makes the rules." It will next meet in April 2010.

Every Rotary Club in the world is invited to submit proposals to change current policies and practices or suggest new ones.

While it is easy to think that your Club is only one of more than 32,000 worldwide and doesn't matter, the changes that have occurred to Rotary over the years have been the result of one of those clubs submitting a proposal. Many of our older Rotarians may remember that Rotary Clubs were once expected to meet once a week every week of the year except on Public Holidays. This was changed as a result of a proposal presented by a club in our District. There are many other changes that have been adopted because one Club had a positive idea about some aspect of Rotary.

Your Club is urged to give thought to Rotary, and if you have an idea for change or the future direction of Rotary please submit it. We must submit our proposals to RI before 31 December this year. The proposal must be endorsed by our District beforehand, so your proposal must be submitted not later than 30 September 30, which does not give us a lot of time.

PDG Geoff Schahinger, who is our representative at the next Council on Legislation, or PDG Allan Wilson who has represented us at the past two Councils, would welcome an invitation to address your Club on this important Rotary function. They are happy to discuss your idea and help your Club to adequately prepare it for submission.

Each year the Government of SA focuses media and public attention on the work done by Service Organisations by presenting the Premier's Community Service Project Awards and the Heidi Taylor Community Service Medal. All service clubs are encouraged to nominate for these awards.
