

Guest Speakers

Betty Johanssen introduced our guest speakers who were representing the **North Fraser Airshow Society**, namely:

- Director **Kris Grasty** (a mortgage broker with Dominion Lending Centres)
- Director **Erissa Yong** (a Re/Max Real Estate Agent) &
- Director **Teena Della** (a Secondary School Teacher)



Both Erissa Yong and Teena Della are themselves pilots, and all three of our guests have spent hundreds of hours to form the Society and put on the Air Show in Pitt Meadows.

The North Fraser Airshow Society is a non-profit organization set up to plan,

organize and fundraise for the North Fraser Airshow which this year will be held at the Pitt Meadows Regional Airport on Sunday, July 20, between 11 a.m. and 2 p.m. 2014, and is part of the airport's annual Airport Day that starts an hour earlier. The society also will be offering scholarships to deserving individuals who are pursuing a career in aviation.

Their Mission Statement is:

- *To promote airshows for the purpose of entertainment and education, while energizing the local economy and tourism;*
- *to support local organizations in their endeavours;*
- *to promote general aviation interests in the community;*
- *and to provide scholarships to deserving individuals in their quest to have a career in aviation and related industries.*

For the first time since 2009, Pitt Meadows Regional Airport will host this aerobatic airshow that is free to the public. It will be filled with a dozen aerobatic acts including local aerobatic pilot Super Dave in his MX2 and wingwalker Carol Pilon. Jumpers from Skydive the City, based at the Pitt Meadows Airport, will be part of the opening act. Everything from educational booths and

hot air balloon rides to aircraft, car and motorcycle displays will be on the day's agenda.

Society director Kris Grasty emphasized the event is free (but donations will be welcomed at the gate as they help the society pay for the show as well as the youth scholarships they offer).

Grasty says his society thought it appropriate to keep the airshow, a first for his group, free as it was an opportunity to "build a namesake" and educate other Lower Mainland residents the Pitt Meadows airport exists. "A lot of people don't even know that airport is there."

Bob Shantz did an excellent job thanking our guests.



The Society's Website NorthFraserAirshow.ca says this about the Youth Scholarship they are offering:

Are you looking at some aspect of aviation for your career? Are you a youth between 13 and 19 years old? Then you will want to apply for the first annual Scholarship:

Value: \$1000

Who: Canadian Youth between ages 13 and 19 years old (by the application deadline of June 30, 2015, the end of the 2014/2015 school year)

Acceptable careers: anything aviation (pilot, aircraft mechanic, air traffic controller, ...)

Application: Write a 1000 word essay stating your career of choice and why you want a career in aviation. Email your essay to ypk@northfraserairshow.ca (no spaces)

Submission deadline: Midnight, June 30, 2015

Selection process: directors of the North Fraser Airshow Society will make their selection from the essays they have received by the deadline. The winner will be contacted and the scholarship awarded on stage at the 2015 airshow (scheduled for Sunday, July 19th next year.)

Money distribution: The scholarship winner will inform the North Fraser Airshow Society where he/she will be doing their aviation training, and the money will be deposited, in the winner's name, with that organization.

Publicity: The scholarship winner will have the opportunity to appear in a photo on this webpage as well as on our facebook page, if desired by him/her. His/her essay may also be published on this website. It is possible that the media will pick up the story as well.
