

Los Altos Rotary Honors Veterans

Community support is seen by Lieutenant Colonel John Lynch of the Marine Corps Special Forces as critical to encourage reenlistment. "What separates Americans from the rest of the world is our community spirit, and there is no community more connected to their military than the Californians," said the keynote speaker, Lieutenant Colonel John Lynch at the Rotary Club of Los Altos' Veterans Day luncheon held November 13.

Lynch has been assigned to all the major military bases in the US and thus has experienced great variety in the ways military personnel are treated in other states. He affirmed that "Very few communities support their military as enthusiastically as Los Altos." This local support encourages service men and women to continue reenlisting and training, thus developing the experience and expertise needed to defend our liberties in complex international situations.

Rotarian Ron Labetich organized the program on November 13 to host a large array of veterans and special guests at Los Altos Rotary's Veterans' Day luncheon. Included were Los Altos Hills Judges Pete and Pattie Manoukian who are parents of Matthew Patrick Manoukian, US Marine Corps Special Forces, killed on duty in Afghanistan 2012. Foothill College President Dr. Judy Miner and local veterans and visitors from other service clubs joined to honor veterans of all wars. It was a packed house!

Ron Labetich heads The Rotary Club of Los Altos' Veterans Support Team and has been especially active in raising funds supporting the Veterans Resource Center on the Foothill College campus. A donation of \$5,000 to the Matthew Manoukian Memorial Scholarship at Foothill College was announced from LAREF (Los Altos Rotary Endowment Fund). One of the vets showed his costly paperback textbook (\$125 used or \$165 new), demonstrating how much the additional \$1,500 donated for vets'

textbook vouchers was appreciated. Finally, \$10,000 was raised to hire a veteran as assistant to Carmela Xuereb in the campus Veterans Resource Center.

In addition, a special donation of \$15,000 was presented to Foothill College President Judy Miner from the Sereno Properties staff in Los Altos to be dedicated to the Captain Matthew Manoukian Memorial Scholarship Fund. President Miner expressed gratitude for the total \$116,000 raised recently to benefit the student veterans on her campus. She was also presented with a flag flown over our nation's capitol to honor Captain Matt Manoukian and a memorial certificate from Congresswoman Anna Eshoo, both of which will be displayed in the Veterans Resource Center.

Justice Pattie Manoukian, mother of Captain Matthew Manoukian, introduced the keynote speaker, Lieutenant Colonel John J. Lynch, US Marine Corps. He was a friend of Matt Manoukian. John Lynch began his presentation by saying, "I've been blown away by the community here. The impact you have on the men and women who wear the uniform is outstanding. A little encouragement keeps them re-enlisting and willing to make sacrifices for our country, like Matt Manoukian did. He was a great representative of everything they stand for."

Since leaving Afghanistan, Lynch's battalion has been re-designated as "foreign fighter lines" to build "source networks" in Indonesia, Malaysia, Thailand and the Philippines. Their goal is to partner with those countries to counter terrorist organizations and "find, fix, finish, analyze, and designate". Finding and fixing are the most difficult roles. "We have to move faster than they do," he said, and we need our armed forces to continue their service for 12-20 years, time enough to gain the expertise necessary to accomplish this goal. That's why Rotary and community support and encouragement are essential in encouraging military men and women to reenlist to defend our liberties.

Technology Corner –Talking about ClubRunner

Okay. So your board decided to get a website and it is from ClubRunner. There are other website configurations but ClubRunner is further along in development of websites suited for Rotary Clubs and Rotary Districts. As a matter of fact, even if your club has not purchased ClubRunner, you are listed on the District 5170 ClubRunner database. If your club has integrated its ClubRunner and Rotary International databases, any data changes you make on your ClubRunner profile will automatically be reflected on www.rotary.org.

To get you started, there are some links to video tutorials offering instructions on the use of ClubRunner's club version.

To gain access to your profile or other member only data on your club's website, you need to LOGIN. The following link will take you to the proper video.

District 5170 to Launch e-Club

Under the leadership of Rotarian Rushton Hurley, a former Ambassadorial Scholar and multiple Paul Harris, the *Rotary e-Club of Silicon Valley* will be chartered early next year in District 5170. Sponsored by the RC of Sunnyvale, the e-Club brings together Rotarians for whom the meeting time restraints of a traditional club are a bad match. By having the flexibility to attend on one's own schedule, the digital meeting place meets the needs of service-minded individuals who want to be engaged in Rotary service.

"Think of it as a way to use technology to tap into Rotarians' talents," clarified Rushton. "It takes familiarity with current technologies and extra discipline to be part of an e-club, but also presents new opportunities." He cited the example from his membership in a former e-club where "mini-e-grants" supported global Rotary service projects. In one instance,

one of the members contacted a Rotarian in Bakersfield with contacts in Shanghai, and e-club Rotarians were able to work with people there to deliver rice to two orphanages in North Korea.

"The e-club gives us the possibility of a membership base that is global. That, in turn, provides us with more opportunities to leverage our resources to serve the local and global needs in our communities."

During the 2004-2010 pilot, e-clubs performed 355 community service projects, 106 international service projects, 55 vocational service projects, and 70 youth service projects. E-clubs gave more than \$150,000 to the Rotary Foundation, including more than \$21,500 to Rotary's \$200 Million Challenge.

The *Rotary e-Club of Silicon Valley* will be modeled on the structure of Rotarian Rushton's former e-club, the Rotary e-Club of Southwest USA. "We hope to launch our website later this winter. We already have 28 Rotary applicants, seven of whom will transfer in from our former e-club to help get our club up and running effectively. One of these members is based in South Africa and two are in Canada. As there are no boundary restrictions on membership in an e-club, we have a global applicant pool. That said, our primary focus will be on Silicon Valley and how we can serve District 5170."

This is certainly an exciting development for District 5170 in its quest to provide opportunities for service-minded individuals to engage in Rotary service. It is a way to utilize technology to meet the needs of others, or, as Rushton says, "to explore how technology can serve service."
