'Tis the Season for Giving Rotarian Generosity is in the Air

In the spirit of the Holiday Season, District 5170 Rotarians are showing their generosity and dedication to Service Above Self through their donations to the Rotary Foundation. As of December 16th, Annual Fund donations totaled \$397,389.89, which is about 6% higher than our total on the same date last year. If you measure the per capita giving against the full membership of 3831 Rotarians, the District is at \$103.73 per member. However, if you measure the per capita giving against the actual members who have made a donation the amount jumps to \$324.40. WOW! In fact if every Rotarian gave at that rate we would generate over \$1,200,000.00! Now that is the way to create a world full of Goodwill, Peace, and Understanding. With more than half the year yet to go, we hope to reach new heights in giving and "Every Rotarian" participation. But don't delay! There is still time to make a 2014 tax-deductible donation to the Rotary Foundation.

As of December 16th, of our 52 Clubs: 6 are over 100% of their Annual Giving goal, and another 6 clubs are over 90%. One club is nearing \$300 per member (Congratulations, Fremont Warm Springs!); 8 clubs are over \$200 per capita; and 32 clubs are over \$100 per member. Kudos go to San Lorenzo Valley and Fremont for achieving 90%+ EREY, and both are just a few members short of achieving 100%. Several other clubs are well on their way! 
