

"Occasionally there is a temptation to criticize the laws, customs and traditions of another country that may seem strange or contrary to our own. In some instances, practices or customs that are illegal in one nation are completely lawful and acceptable in another.

As we strive to strengthen the bonds of understanding, goodwill and friendship, these policies still provide good advice and guidance."

# Harris' Homilies: Words of Wisdom By Rotary Founding Father Paul Harris

"Since the beginning of civilization, there has been a surplus of sayers of things. If there is any one particular in which I would have Rotary distinguished from other organizations, it is the quality of character which results in the doing of things."

"The way to war is a well-paved highway and the way to peace is still a wilderness. War is always a ghastly blunder; even the winners lose."

"We are in no further need of politicians; we need some statesmen now."

"We need in this world a much better and clearer understanding of the worth of some things and of the worthlessness of others."

"Wealth is too high priced when it's cost is honor, integrity, or happiness."

"It is reasonable to expect that it will be fashionable some day to build lives instead of fortunes."

"He who can abandon himself in the interest of a cause in which he unreservedly believes is indeed fortunate."

"The greatest resource which a nation can have is the resource of peace; it counts for more than arable lands, more than mines of untold riches."

"Paul Harris was a prolific writer. In addition to his autobiography, "My Road To Rotary," which was published in 1948, he was the author of two other volumes about Rotary ("The Founder Of Rotary," 1928, and "This Rotarian Age," 1935). He also penned three volumes of "Peregrinations," detailing his worldwide travels and a separate account concerning his trip to Nice for the 1937 RI Convention and a post-convention tour of the British Isles."
