The Living History of the Zither



The Living History of the Zither – Beyond a Single Picture on the Museum Wall

Nine years ago, much of what seemed to be known about the zither in this area was found in a picture on the museum wall at the German American Heritage Center in Davenport, Iowa. The picture was of the Davenport Zither Club, dated 1885. Extensive research at that time uncovered the rich history of the zither in Davenport, including being host to the 1913 National Zither Congress. With the onset of World War I and Prohibition the zither, like so many other things German, faded away like a distant memory and it succumbed to becoming a single picture on the museum wall.

Much has changed for the zither in Davenport since this extensive research was published in a series of articles in the German American Heritage Centers quarterly, *Infoblatt*, in 2001. A remarkable resurgence of people interested in learning, playing and performing the zither in this community has occurred. The Zither Ensemble in Davenport has grown to become the largest community based zither ensemble in the United States – with a continued commitment to encourage

and grow new zither players. Through a partnership we have developed between the German American Heritage Center, the Zither Ensemble, and master zither player, Tomy Temerson, of Germany, we have now hosted two North American Zither Gatherings with plans for a third one in March 2011. We are also beginning to develop our center as a Zither hub of support for Zither players across North America.

At our Rotary Club meeting on Friday, January 29, local zitherist, Anne Prinz will share with you a little history of the zither, demonstrate how the instrument is played, and discuss the future plans of the living history of zither in our community and beyond.

About our presenter: Anne Prinz is a member of the Zither Ensemble at the German American Heritage Center as well as the Chicago Zither Club. She is the Coordinator of the North American Zither Gathering and Chairperson for the Zither Education Project at the German American Heritage Center. In 2009 she was selected by master zither player, Tomy Temerson, to come to Germany for an intensive zither teacher training and zither repair instruction. She now teaches beginning Zither lessons at the German American Heritage Center, repairs and refurbishes zithers, and coordinates Zither education outreach programs

North Scott Rotary member, Margo McInnis stepped in at the last minute and gave a very informative program on January 22 about what the Quad Cities Convention and Visitors Bureau has to offer. Margo is Director of Sales and her office is on River Drive in Moline. Margo and others in her office promote **Host It Here!** They will help with your event planning in the Quad Cities. They can assist you in gaining competitive bids to locate your meeting or conference in the Quad Cities area. They will make suggestions on venues, provide contacts for details and assist with media relations.

The QCCVB plays a major role in providing marketing support to the area's attractions, businesses, and events. They sell the communities through trade shows, direct calls, advertising, marketing and public relations efforts. Did you know that over 1 million people visit the Quad Cities every year? These same people create \$125 million economic impact on our region annually, and help keep over 9000 people employed in the QC.
