Editorial

Having been either scholarship winners or Group Study Exchange participants, I urge therefore that all Clubs keep in close touch with these recipients after graduation before they disappear into the community or lost to other service organizations.

There is, however, light at the end of the tunnel as a recent search by PDG Al Casserly has unearthed a candidate who has distinguished herself in no small way since being an Ambassadorial scholar. Mrs. Pat Sinclair-McCalla is a 1982 Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholar sponsored by the Rotary Club of St. Andrew. Mrs. McCalla has served as Permanent Secretary to three Prime Ministers of Jamaica – The Most Hon. Percival James Patterson, The Most Hon. Portia Simpson-Miller and Hon. Bruce Golding. She is currently Chief Executive Officer of the Public Sector Transformation Unit with responsibility to rationalize and restructure the Public Service of Jamaica. GROUP STUDY EXCHANGE

Bigger, Better, Bolder.

District Governor Diana, in keeping with this year's theme, has set out an ambitious program for Group Study Exchanges from our district. This year, we shall have two teams departing our shores, and one team visiting us.

From Haiti, Rosa Leger will lead a team of four (4) young professionals between the ages of 25 and 40, to District 6970 in Florida. This team will depart from Haiti on April 8, 2011 for St. Thomas to attend our District Conference. They leave St. Thomas on April 10 for Jacksonville, where they will be hosted by Rotarians in their homes during their four week stay in that district. During their stay, they will give presentations to Rotary clubs on their homes, families, Haiti and its history, geography and places of interest. This cultural and vocational exchange will expose them to the history and culture of Jacksonville and other areas of that district, visit places of interest, and most importantly of all, interact with their hosts and be exposed to the norms of life in that area. It is a wonderful experience and opportunity to share how the team members think as they interact with their hosts, and are exposed to a different language, the areas of commerce and its government.

Exchanges such as this offers participants a unique opportunity to develop leadership skills, work on team building and increase self confidence. It is anticipated that these exchanges will have an invaluable impact on the participants' careers, creating opportunities for networking and developing lifelong friendships. This team will return to our district on May 8, 2011.

The Exchange team from District 6970 will arrive in Providenciales, Turks and Caicos Islands, on March 12, 2011. This incoming team of five will be hosted by Rotarians during their stay in our district, and will tentatively be a team involved in the hospitality and marine fields. They will depart the Turks and Caicos Islands for the Bahamas on approx. March 25, where they will be hosted by their Rotarians for another two weeks, before departing for St. Thomas on April 7 to attend and present at our District Conference. They return to Jacksonville on April 10, 2011.

Our other team, all from the Hospitality and Tourism industry and led by Rebecca Low, will leave St. Maarten and arrive in London, Heathrow on May 1, 2011. This five member team (including Team Leader Rebecca), will be hosted by District 1170 in Devon, a delightful part of the country in southwest England. They will be exposed to the English way of life and an abundance of historical landmarks in the area. In my youth, I spent a summer sailing in the Kingsbridge estuary in Devon, a truly enlightening experience which I am sure the team members will enjoy. The team departs London on May 31 to return to St. Maarten.

Individuals participating in this once in a lifetime experience will return home with a broadened cultural perspective, and a new understanding of people in another part of the world.

To be eligible, applicants must be;

- Between the ages of 25 and 40
- Be fully employed, with at least two years experience in their chosen field
- Be in their early/mid stages of their careers or professions
- Reside in, and be employed in the sending district
- Be citizens of the country in which they reside
- Be proficient in the language of the country being visited
- Be personable, articulate, cooperative, motivated team players, and enthusiastic about their professions
- Seek to gain a maximum educational value from the program, as well as be able to fulfill the rigorous demands of international travel, and active participation in an extensive itinerary

Rotary clubs in Haiti and St. Maarten/Sint Martin/Anguilla/St. Barts are encouraged to nominate qualified candidates for consideration for selection as a member of the respective teams.

Polio Eradication and the \$200,000,000 Challenge...

[Artist Rossin Raytchev Paints Portrait of Paul Harris to Help Rotary's US\\$200 Million Challenge](#)

Artist Rossin Raytchev (member of the Rotary club of Atlanta, Georgia, USA, D6900) has painted portraits of US Presidents George H.W. Bush and George W. Bush, baseball great Hank Aaron and an American Royalty Collection that includes large-scale likenesses of Abraham Lincoln, George Washington, and Jackie Kennedy. He has now painted a portrait of Paul Harris to help raise money to meet the challenge.

"The fundamental difference between the photograph and my painting is in the photograph you see person, in the painting you see the personality," Rossin says. "With Paul Harris, that's a face which is not necessarily dramatically attractive or different than anybody else's, however if you take a closer look you will discover a wonderful human being who is very sensitive, very detailed oriented, very disciplined." 2010. All proceeds will be contributed to Rotary's US\$200 million challenge, and will be credited to the Rotarian's Rotary Foundation account.

Zone 34 Polio Challenge Contest: July 1, 2010 to April 30, 2011

The contest will recognize clubs for community awareness/fundraising polio eradication projects. Each district will get 30,000 Foundation recognition points to use as they wish to recognize the top 3 club projects. Clubs could use those points to match cash contributions and become a 100% PHF club! The DG, DRFC and PPC will be the judges.

The 3 winners from each district will be submitted to Robert Hall with a picture and write-up so we can share their stories with the entire Zone. To get the 30,000 recognition points, the district must also contribute a minimum 10% of their rollover DDF. We hope this will help every club contribute to the polio challenge. Their Rotarian members will be able to say **"Polio eradication is MY gift to the world. It is MY legacy."**

In May, the Rotary club of Winder, Georgia USA (D6910) sent a check to then DG Shane Burr for \$7,783.88, representing its full commitment to the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation's \$200 million challenge. While that's a great story of its own, what is most remarkable is the way the money was raised.

Dr. Claire Miller, the Winder Club's Rotary Foundation Chair and Assistant Superintendent for Teaching and Learning for Barrow County Schools, coordinated a "Pennies for Polio" campaign – designed to increase school children's awareness of polio and eradication efforts. The schools held a contest to see which homeroom could collect the most money. Dr. Miller also coordinated production of a video featuring Chip Thompson, Mayor of Winder and a victim of polio. Over two weeks, teachers and children collected funds – the winning homeroom was awarded a pizza party or an equivalent of their choice.

A team from **D6970 (Florida, USA)** will lead a group of Rotarians from around the world on a trip to India to participate in one of the country's National Immunization Days (NIDs), when 180 million children throughout the country will receive the polio immunization over the course of 4-5 days. The trip will be some time in January/February 2011.

Enormous progress has been made in the worldwide battle against polio and we are in the homestretch! Join us and be a part of this historic world event while having the opportunity to personally immunize dozens of underprivileged children.

This will be a 12-day trip. Final dates will be selected in September/October when the India government announces the official NID dates for the country. Price: about \$3,500, including air fare (which you book on your own), ground transportation, 4-5 star hotel accommodations, some meals and sightseeing excursions. Sunday, 24 October 2010 is World Polio Day as determined by the UN. Rotarians around the world are planning events in celebration of this day. In San Francisco, approximately 2,000 people are expected to walk the Golden Gate Bridge along with President Ray. A lighting of the Ferry Terminal with END POLIO NOW is planned for the evening

Want extra recognition points to become a Paul Harris Fellow? Want your Rotary Club to become a 100% Paul Harris Fellow Club? Want our District to become a 100% Paul Harris Fellow District? Encourage Rotarians to give a minimum of US\$100 to PolioPlus **on line** and get 2 recognition points for every 1 dollar contributed to PolioPlus the week of Monday Oct 18 to Sunday Oct 24.

For the week leading up to this event, The Rotary Foundation will be offering 2 for 1 recognition credit for every contribution of US\$100 or more made to polio on-line. The strategy is to encourage Rotarians to experience our on-line giving application in the hopes that they will find it simple and easy and come back to it again and again. On-line contribution processing is much less expensive than processing checks through the bank lockbox. The opportunity would be open to all Rotarians worldwide for one week.

Future Vision Pilot News

WHAT IS HAPPENING THIS MONTH

Future Vision pilot underway

The Future Vision pilot officially launched two months ago. Here's a summary of activity as of 1 September:

- 95 districts have been qualified
- 28 district grant applications have been approved
- 25 global grants have been approved

Areas of focus poster mailing

One set of six area of focus posters was mailed to each pilot district's Rotary Foundation committee chair last month. Districts can use the posters to promote Future Vision with member clubs and educate them about the [goals of the areas of focus](#).

District grant spending plans

The Foundation has already approved a number of 2010-11 district grant applications. Four districts (1970, 2650, 3330, and 6560) have kindly agreed to share their [district grant spending plans](#) with other pilot districts. Each spending plan provides brief information about each of the projects the district plans to support with district grant funds, including the name of the participating clubs and the amount allocated to these projects. We hope these documents can serve as a helpful reference to your district as you select 2010-11 district grant projects and begin preparing your [online district grant application](#).

Partnerships with nonpilot districts

Many of you have had questions about partnerships with districts outside the pilot. Ideally, the Foundation encourages pilot districts to work primarily within the new grant model as much as possible during the next three years. The Foundation will lose some of its ability to test the new grant model if pilot and nonpilot districts are working together extensively.

However, the Foundation understands that districts have longstanding relationships that they don't want to put on hold for the next three years. Districts do have some options for working together during the pilot. RRFC Brenda Cressey notes one possible approach: Her district appointed a pilot/nonpilot project coordinator. This person is available to help both pilot and nonpilot districts find new partners for their projects.

Global grant financing tips

More pilot clubs and districts are submitting global grant applications. During the grant application process, clubs and districts must decide how they would like to finance their grants. They may use cash and/or District Designated Fund contributions, which are, in turn, matched by the Foundation. Using DDF contributions is encouraged whenever possible, because the grant sponsors will receive a 100 percent match, as opposed to a 50 percent match with cash. Also, funding your global grant contributions entirely with DDF will significantly speed up the payment process. Interested clubs should ask their district leaders about using DDF instead of cash contributions for their global grant applications.

Preparing for GETS

Governors-elect training seminars began in August and will continue through December. Before attending GETS, district governors-elect should prepare by reviewing the [district memorandum of understanding](#) and [grant terms and conditions](#) and visiting the [Rotary E-Learning Center](#) to understand the [basics of Future Vision](#). Contact your regional Rotary Foundation coordinator for more information.
