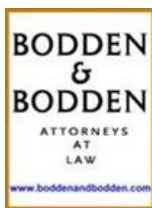

Rotary Sunrise Lights up Camana Bay with "End Polio Now" Message



From February 23rd to March 9th, night time drivers passing Camana Bay will notice a larger than life message declaring Rotary's pledge to rid the world of this crippling childhood disease. The message will first appear in lights against the side of an expansive office building in Camana Bay on the 106th anniversary of Rotary International.

This project was planned and executed by VP Tony, who is also the Sunrise Club's PolioPlus Chair. Lighting up the building in Camana Bay is part of a worldwide drive to elevate public awareness of Rotary's pledge to rid the earth of polio's crippling effects. Camana Bay will join the following famous landmarks in displaying the "End Polio Now" message: Trevi Fountain in Rome; the parliament building in The Hague; the soccer stadium in Cape Town, South Africa; a gate at the Lantern Festival in Taiwan; Kanazawa Castle in Kanazawa, Japan; the government building in Karachi, Pakistan; the planetarium in Seoul, Korea; the Globe of the Mall of Asia in the Philippines; Byblos Castle in Byblos, Lebanon, and the Charminar in Hyderabad, India.

As VP Tony reminds us, "The bottom line is this: As long as polio threatens even one child anywhere in the world, all children — wherever they live — remain at risk."



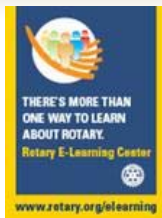
