What is a Matching Grant?

In fact a Matching Grant is exactly what you intuitively would think it is. It is a grant that is matched by the Rotary Foundation. Here is an example that Rotary Sunrise with the other clubs in the Cayman Islands is



working on. The public hospitals in the Cayman Islands look for funding of necessary medical equipment that they are unable to fund from direct revenue or subsidy from Government. Like many other hospitals in the world, they have set up a Foundation, in this case the Cayman Islands Caring for Life Foundation (CFLF), a non-profit organization to raise funds for medical equipment. The CFLF has approached the Rotary Clubs for help.

Rather than the Rotary Clubs directly providing the funds for specific medical equipment, they decide to not only join forces locally, but also globally. After all, Rotary clubs help the community, both locally and globally. If there is a good community project in the Cayman Islands, there should be clubs outside of Cayman that want to join us to help with a project that has been identified by the Rotary clubs of the Cayman Islands as useful and necessary.

Rather than that the Rotary clubs outside of the Cayman Islands directly provide the funds, the project is carried out as a Matching Grant. This is where the magic is because monetary donations increase. \$5,000 from Sunrise has the potential to become well in excess of \$100,000. It goes like this: each Rotary Club in the Cayman Islands pledges \$5,000; that is \$20,000 for the 4 clubs. Each club finds an overseas partner that matches the contribution, so we end up with \$40,000 (or more if we find more partners). The Rotary Foundation, through its Matching Grant programme matches the total from the Rotary clubs and we end up with at least \$60,000 or \$80,000.

Through Matching Grants, The Rotary Foundation matches contributions raised for international service projects by Rotary clubs and districts in two or more countries. The Foundation provides a one-to-one match for District Designated Fund (DDF)/SHARE contributions; basically this is a Matching Grant that goes through the District. If it does no go through the District the Foundation provides a \$0.50 match for every new \$1 cash contribution. Grant awards range from \$5,000 to \$200,000.

The Foundation, promoting good stewardship of funds, has several criteria and requirements for Matching Grants, to ensure that the money is well spent, properly accounted for and that the project receives proper recognition in the media, both in the country where the project takes place as well as in the country where donors are located. It is a must that local Rotarians and their overseas partners are involved in the project and ensure that money is well spent. If there is a partnership with local organizations, they must be bonafide and non-profit.

In summary, Matching Grants of the Rotary Foundation help to increase the funding of community projects carried out by Rotarian project partners in different countries; if the project is endorsed by the district of the receiving club, funds may be matched dollar for dollar, if it does not go through the district, funds are matched 50 cents to the dollar.
