

### Getting to Know: Sandra Finnegan

I moved to the Cayman Islands four years ago to take up a position at Aon Insurance Managers where I currently work as a Senior Account Manager. Before leaving the UK I trained and worked as an accountant. I first got involved in community service through a company sponsored project, whilst working for Sony, and community service has been part of my life ever since. I particularly enjoy projects working with children and it was this that lead me to take an eight month career break to do voluntary work in Asia.



My first project was teaching English in Rajasthan in India. Rajasthan could not have been more different from my native England and arriving there was a total culture shock. It was hot, dusty, smelly, noisy, crowded, colorful chaos. And I loved it from the moment I arrived! The children I taught had none of the luxuries most children take for granted. The schools had no electricity or running water and the children sat on the floor as there were no chairs or desks. But they did have tons of enthusiasm and a burning desire to learn. My time volunteering in Asia was an incredibly rewarding experience. Whilst working in Cayman I am saving to fund a further year out to volunteer full time again.

During my time in Cayman I have continued to be involved in community service through the Aon charity committee. I also set up my own environmental volunteer group earlier this year. The group is called "Cayman Wombles" and our mission is "to keep Cayman clean through action and education". We organize monthly beach clean ups, and are in the process of setting up environmental education sessions for local schools. I hope that through Rotary Sunrise I can get involved with more community service projects in Cayman.

After an icebreaker conducted by Director Deborah Chambers, President Andrea presented the results of a survey conducted in January 2012 to determine how well the club is doing.
