The Newest Rotary Fellowship Targets Shutterbugs

You don't have to be skilled with a camera to enjoy Rotary's newest fellowship, the International Fellowship of Rotarian Photographers.

The fellowship, which was recognized by the RI Board of Directors in January, counts amateur and professional photographers among its members, as well as those who have an appreciation for photography.

"Our group is open to anyone at any skill level, from point-and-shoot beginners to longtime professionals," says Layne Marshal, a member of the Rotary Club of Campbell River Daybreak, British Columbia, Canada, who chairs the fellowship. "We have 65 members on our membership list in Canada, the United States, Europe, Australia, and India, but that list is probably incomplete."

Marshal, an amateur photographer, was interested in joining a fellowship where he could meet other Rotarians and sharpen his skills, but found that there wasn't such a group. After learning that others had attempted to form a photography fellowship, he worked with them to file the appropriate paperwork with RI.

"I certainly did not develop this all on my own," he stresses.

As a newer group, the fellowship is still developing activities, but it has an online forum for members to share advice, ask and answer questions, or otherwise discuss photography. It is also building a website for members to display their work, receive or offer critiques, and take part in competitions.

"I enjoy the challenges and rewards of capturing a good photograph, which I feel is too often more luck than skill in my case," Marshal says. "I know there are lots of people out there who are interested in photography and would join an effort to share and learn."

The photography fellowship, and the Rotarian Jazz Fellowship which became official in September, are among 62 recognized by RI. Fellowships bring Rotarians, their spouses, and Rotaractors together to share common interests, explore new opportunities to serve, have fun, and promote vocational development through friendship. Each June, they are celebrated during Rotary Fellowships Month.

During this time Mr. Manderson also completed a Law Degree at the Cayman Islands Law School and took a year out of government to do his articles with Walkers after which he was called to the Caymanian Bar.

In 2003, Mr. Manderson became the Chief Immigration Officer, a post he held for 5-years.

In 2009, he was appointed Chief Officer of the Portfolio of Internal and External Affairs. During his time as Chief Officer he has improved the strategic effectiveness of the Portfolio and has overseen the introduction of key pieces of crime-reduction legislation: the Alternative Sentencing Law, the Police Law and the Information and Communications Technology Authority Regulations.

Mr. Manderson took up the position of Deputy Governor of the Cayman Islands on the retirement of Mr. Donovan Ebanks in January 2012.

August 2011

October 2011

November 2011

Birthday Party for the Pines Residents. Provide food and entertainment for all the residents and staff. We also purchase gifts for those residents whose birthdays are in November. Various other organizations each look after one month throughout the year, our month is November.

December 2011

Attend and provide funding for the various Community Christmas parties held around the Island, organized through Children and Family Services.

Attend and provide funding for a Seniors Christmas party also through CFS, usually held at the Seaman's Centre.

Provide music for singing Christmas carols along with light refreshments at the Pines.

Attend the Sunrise Adult Training Centre Christmas Concert at one of the Schools. SATC will advise where and when it will be held.

January 2012

Purchase the gift vouchers for the Drug Rehabilitation Program put on by the Drug Court. These are purchased in varying amounts ranging from \$10 - \$25, to be used as incentives and rewards throughout the program. These are usually in the form of cinema tickets, bookstore gift certificates, fast food or health food certificates, grocery store certificates. Annual budget is approx \$2500.

Provide assistance/funding if requested with the Prospect Park Family Fun Day, organized through CFS.

February 2012

Art@Governors – provide food, drinks and snacks. Prepare, cook and serve approximately 110 – 120 artists and volunteers for this annual, well attended event. Once the artists and volunteers are served (they will have tickets provided to them), then you can sell the remaining items you have to the public. This was a big success this year and we were able to bring some money back into our Club.

March 2012

Heart Health Fair – provide organized games, face painting and prizes for the Kiddie Corner throughout the day. Also provide snacks.

Smith Barcadere – purchased for assembly 3 picnic tables for the beach area. They came assembled so the project was quite short. Fun, but short.

April 2012

Chamber Roadside Clean-up – This is an annual event and Rotary Sunrise provides a team of volunteers to work in specified areas. Coordinated through the Chamber of Commerce.

Cecile Creighton Park in Spotts Newlands – replenished the sand, trimmed the trees and shrubs at the park.

May 2012

Darkness to Light Training was held in May and 17 people attended. It is highly recommended that all Rotarians attend this program, particularly if they are involved in any kind of activities that involve children, both for the children's safety as well as their own.

Big Brothers Big Sisters Joint Event – first event of this kind held at the Cecile Creighton Park in Spotts Newlands. We provided hamburgers, drinks, snacks and some games. Attended mostly by the children who did not have mentors and there were not enough BBBS staff to provide supervision. In future, we should have a more structured event so the children are monitored more closely to eliminate any possible adverse situations from occurring.

Other ongoing events and special requests

SATC - Rotary Sunrise has been supporting the Sunrise Adult Training Center for a number of years. In the past we have done small work projects, arranged outings to the cinema, provided monetary assistance for dinners out. Liaison is with Shari, the new director at the Center. Budget this year was \$6000 but we used funds for other projects as the staff this year did not respond to our offers for help. Having a dedicated person to keep in touch with them on a regular basis helps, and they had a change of Directors this year which had a lot to do with their planning of events. The amount allocated could be significantly reduced so as to be used for other worthwhile projects.

Francis Boddin Girl's – No budget allocated. There are a number of other community minded organizations that do small projects out there. This year we donated a new freezer to replace their old one. Their requirements are ongoing.

Caribbean Haven - No budget allocated. They also appreciate work projects such as painting, minor repairs, etc. This is ongoing throughout the year.

Lionfish Spears – This came in through President Andrea as a request to our Club. We donated the cost which was \$346.50. It was a special request and not in the budget.

Vocational Awards – Budget allocated is \$300 and is used when requested and agreed by the Board and Committee.

JUNK Bins – Proposal brought to the Board by Winston to see if our Club would be interested in providing some funding for glass recycle bins at various locations in the districts. Unanimously supported by the Board. Funds agreed to come out of New Generations and into Community Services in the amount of \$5000. Rotary Sunrise logo to go on the bins.
