Speaker's Corner - Ms. Aubrey Bodden

Topic: Gender Equality Law, 2011 and the Local Legislative Framework for Eliminating Discrimination in Employment



Aubrey Bodden is employed by the Ministry of Education, Employment and Gender Affairs as the Policy Officer for Gender Affairs and Secretary to the Gender Equality Tribunal. She previously worked in the Cabinet Office as a Research Officer and Policy Analyst. In these roles she has been an integral part of important cultural shifts in the public service and in Caymanian society and continues to work toward building capacity for positive social change.

Aubrey holds a BA in Government and History with minors in International Relations and Law & Society and is currently pursuing an MSc in Public Policy and Management. Working with the Senior Policy Officer (Gender Affairs), Aubrey conducts policy research and analysis to assist in providing gender-sensitive policy advice to the Ministry and wider public service. Her other major duties include providing administrative support to the Gender Equality Tribunal, educating the public on the Gender Equality Law, enhancing public awareness of gender issues, and helping to mainstream a gender perspective within government.

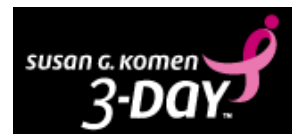
