Our programmes are offered free of charge to students and schools. These programmes teach students crucial lessons about work readiness, entrepreneurship, and financial literacy: we prepare young people to enter the workforce, train them to become the next generation of business leaders, and educate them about basic financial management and responsibility.

Rotary Sunrise supports Junior Achievement each year by providing a group of Advisors and sponsoring a JA company. These Advisors work with a group of approximately 15 high school students ("Achievers") to mentor them through the process and provide hands on experience to understand what is required to start-up and run a company. These Achievers go through the life of a company; electing a President, VP's of Sales, Production, Finance and Human Resources. The Advisors run the first 2-3 meetings until the president is elected. They will work with the students to come up with 1 or 2 products to make, choose a company name and then buy materials and focus on production of those products. JA organizes some sales events mainly leading up to Christmas. Rotary Sunrise Advisors organize their own sales days at grocery stores. By February the company winds down selling off inventory, preparing annual reports and submitting them to JA.

JA then organizes a banquet in May where awards are presented to:

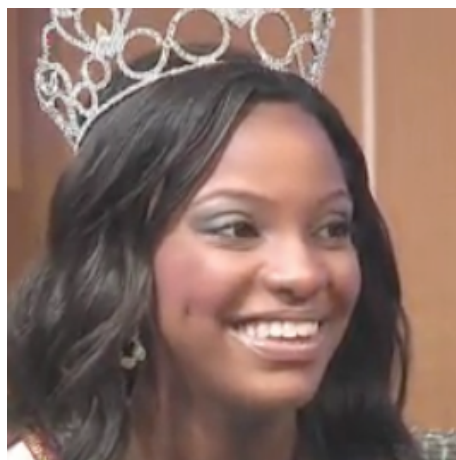
- Best Company
- Best Product
- Best President and VP'S of the Year

In addition, 8 students are announced who are selected for the International Conference held in Canada in August.

Last year Rotary Sunrise had 4 Rotarian Advisors; Dawn Cummings, Howard Cross, Ian Comins and David Reid. The advisors commit to an 18-week time frame once per week from 6-8pm from mid-October to March. If there are enough advisors it's not necessary for all advisors to attend every weekly meeting.

RI Has Mandated a Change...Sort Of

Did you notice? It seems that Rotary International has changed the appearance of the Rotary Wheel (or Gear, if you want to be technically correct).

The change actually happened early this month. But there has been such an active debate regarding it that I wanted to wait and see what RI's response might be.

So far, there has been no response at all from the officials at RI. However Antoinette Tuscano, a senior supervisor at RI Editorial Services, has weighed in on a few LinkedIn discussions and urged Rotarians to give the new emblem a change.

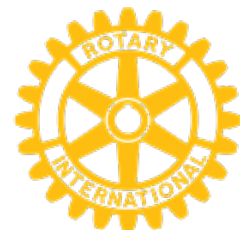
At first glance, you may not have even noticed the change. I know that I didn't.

Basically, the Rotary Wheel is now a single golden color. The blue background behind the Wheel's gold lettering and the blue outlining the gears have been eliminated. The new Wheel has also been dubbed the "Mark of Excellence" in the 34-page "Voice and Visual Identity Guidelines for Rotarians" manual. (If you'd like a copy, just e-mail me and I'll send it to you.)

The new Wheel ("Mark of Excellence" just sounds too corny to use among Rotarians) really looks good against a dark colored background. But golden-yellow on a white

letterhead really isn't a strong color combination. The RI solution for placing the new Wheel on incompatible backgrounds is to also allow use of the Wheel in black or blue or white.

More than one million Rotarians worldwide have contributed to the success of the polio eradication effort.

The initial goal was to simplify and freshen up the Rotary brand. But it seems that the jury is still out on some of the accompanying requirements for the "Masterbrand Signature" (basically the word "Rotary" in front of the new Wheel). For example, page 16 of the guidelines manual states that club names should appear in small letters under the word "Rotary" in the Masterbrand.

For us, that means five words tucked under the single word Rotary. Or, we can split it up to have "Grand Cayman Sunrise" in small letters over the big "Rotary" with "Club" in small letters under that. That's fine, but it's not really how our name appears in our Articles of Association and other legal documents. And what's with separating the word Rotary from our club name, anyway?

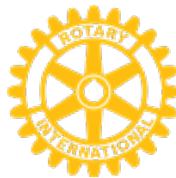


We had an excellent turn out on Saturday's Peace Day for the joint project with the Family Resource Centre. A total of 15 Rotarians and approximately another 15 Rotaractors came out to show their support and contribute to the hands on project. Overall there were over 50 volunteers and over 150+ persons who attended. We planted over 30 trees at the park which

would not have been possible without the help of our Rotarians and families including over 10 kids who assisted. The trees planted were mainly indigenous trees to Cayman and included; grape, poui, golden shower, lignum vitea, mahogany, name tree, silver buttonwood and cocoplum. Thankfully there was a backhoe donated by Millenium Equipment to assist us in digging the holes making the job much easier and prevented some aches and pains the next day for most of us. All of the Trees were donated by the department of agriculture. Other activities included a DJ, a live band, the painting of large rock boulders, a peace puzzle, a large peace rock labyrinth, a large mosaic peace garden sign, a flash mob dance featuring one of our very own Rotarians and an official Government speech at the event.



Thanks again to all the Rotarian and Rotaractor volunteers and Miriam Foster from the Family Resource Centre who organized the successful event.
