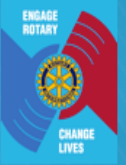

### What the Prez Sez...

## Transforming from Exclusivity to Inclusivity

History is amazing because it's always happening. In fact, we are once again watching Rotary transform before our very eyes.

All of us know how Rotary got started. In 1905, Paul Harris (a young lawyer) was lonely living in the big city of Chicago. So he gathered three business acquaintances (a tailor, a coal merchant, and a mining engineer) for the purpose of doing some mutually beneficial client networking. The network grew. And the first community service project (public toilets) was really intended to keep people shopping for longer periods of time and doing business with their companies.



At that time Rotary's motto was, "One profits most who serves best"

The network kept growing. And in 1911, the first club outside the United States was established in Ireland. In 1916, the first club in a non-English speaking nation was established in Cuba. In 1921, Rotary formally determined that racial restrictions would not be permitted, as the organization spread across Asia.

The network continued to grow, but as a male-only club until 1987 when women were first approved for membership by Rotary International.

Now, in 2013, Rotary is once again expanding the membership parameters. Thanks to this year's Council on Legislation (COL), we can now invite to membership people who have never worked in a business (housewives and househusbands) and people who are not currently working in a business (retirees and job-seekers).

AG Joey Hew mentioned this COL provision at Saturday's inter club forum, stressing the District's support for these new non-job classifications. Clearly,

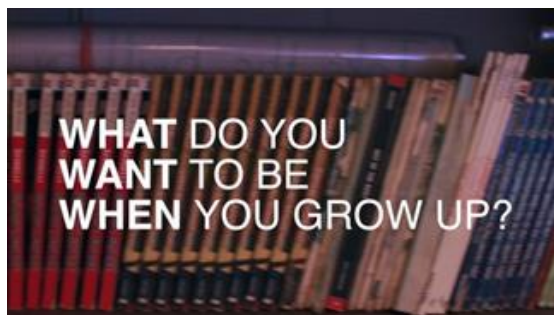

For those of you that were not in attendance at last Wednesday's meeting, this information serves to advise that I will be acting as the club's Elections Officer for our

upcoming elections. The elections themselves will be held at our weekly meeting of October 30th but for the next 3 weeks leading up to the election date, we will be looking for nominations for the following board positions,

You'll note that President Elect (PE), Kim Remizowski is looking to decrease the size of the Governing Body (Board) from a minimum of 13 as required by our club's Amended Articles of Association to a minimum of 8.

As you may know our club's membership has fallen by approximately 25% over the past 12 to 15 months. We are now approximately 78 members including honorary Rotarians and there are another 5 potential members where their membership is in question whether it be clubs dues, attendance or other. This decrease in membership has translated into a much smaller club than we envisioned.

Governing Body, the Club's Articles of Association which were recently amended in June of 2012 will require a further but small amendment.

Section 93 pertains to the AMENDMENT TO THE ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION whereby by the company may add to, alter or amend the provisions of these Articles and may be amended at any regular meeting, a quorum being present, by a two-thirds vote of all Members present, provided that notice of such proposed amendment shall be provided to each member at least ten (10) days before such meeting. No amendment or addition to these Articles can be made which is not in Harmony with the RI Constitution.

Reference is then made to Section 45 GOVERNING BODY where the Governing body of the Company shall be a board of directors consisting of the Executive and a minimum of seven (7) other Directors, each of whom shall be a Member in good standing. More specifically, Section 45 reads as follows,

#### 45. Governing Body

**The governing body of the Company shall be a board of directors consisting of the Executive and a minimum of seven (7) other Directors, each of whom shall be a Member in good standing of the Company. The Board shall have general control over all Officers and committees and, for good cause, may declare an office vacant.**

**The first Directors shall be determined in writing by the subscribers to the Memorandum of Association. The number of Directors shall not be less than one unless the Company shall otherwise resolve.**

PE Kim would like to amend the Articles of Association by changing the number of Directors to a minimum of two (2) Directors and has made a motion (which has been seconded by Past President Andrea) to amend Section 45 to read as follows,

#### 45. Governing Body

**The Governing body of the Company shall be a board of directors consisting of the Executive and a minimum of two (2) other Directors, each of whom shall be a Member in good standing. The Board shall have general control over all Officers and committees and, for good cause, may declare an office vacant.**

**The first Directors shall be determined in writing by the subscribers to the Memorandum of Association. The number of Directors shall not be less than one unless the company shall otherwise resolve.**

In order to ensure the structure is in place on election day (Oct 30th) we are hereby providing 10 days notice to all members so that a vote can be taken at our club meeting of Wednesday October 16th. If there is a quorum and 2/3 of the membership agrees, then Kim's structure will stand.

We say goodbye to **Simon Watson** and wish him well in life and within his profession.

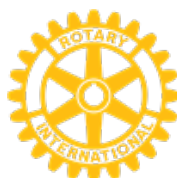


### Healthcare Conference on Workplace Wellness
