International Service - Providing Drinking Water to Families in Cambodia

In partnership with the Rotary Club of San Pedro, CA, Rotary Sunrise has provided **US\$1,000** to aid with construction of multi-family wells for 3 new villages in central Cambodia's Kampong Thom province. Work will begin from this new grants offered through this international partnership in January 2014 once the area dries out from the heavy rains.



Last year, Rotary Sunrise had the same partnership with the Rotary Club of San Pedro and it worked out so well that the recent project has just completed in Anghor Chey in the Kampot province of Cambodia. This project not only dealt with the drilling and installation of the wells but offered training on pump maintenance, health and hygiene classes and

promotion of mobile village events for water and sanitation devices within the project areas. This project saw the completion of 9 wells that will supply drinking

water to at least 25 families. Attached are some recent photos of the project that includes the families who will benefit from the wells.

Many changes have taken place in our club since the start of this Rotary year. Some of those changes are obvious, but others are subtle adjustments to the course that was set by the present Board before the year even began.

I'm grateful for VP Frank's assistance at the start of this Rotary year, but Kim brings needed fundraising experience and he's being assisted by another fundraising pro: IPP Tony. They are putting the finishing touches on a Pirate's Treasure raffle that will coincide with the Pirate's Week celebrations and promises to be an easy way to generate funds for PE Kim's year in 2014-2015.

Another change that you will be asked to vote on this week involves reducing the size of the Sunrise Board, as mandated by our [club's bylaws](#). IPP Tony has discussed those changes at the last three club meetings and this week you'll have an opportunity to vote whether you approve.

But rest assured that these changes do not alter the goals that the club crafted for the 2013-2014 Rotary year. Our Planning Guide (which is available to you on the Club's website) remains the basis of all the Board's decisions. It's simply that every voyage requires some flexibility to navigate safely and arrive at the intended destination.

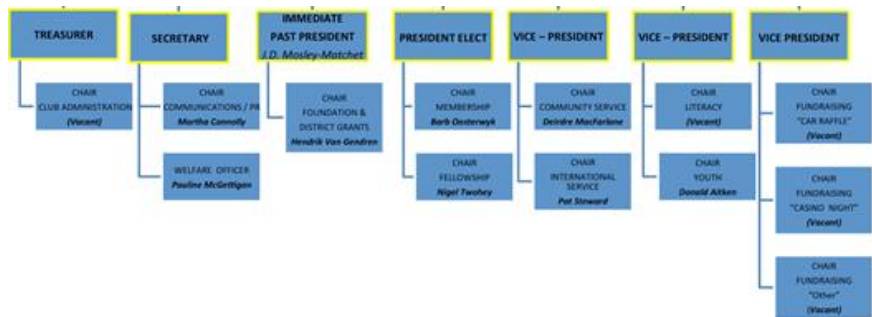

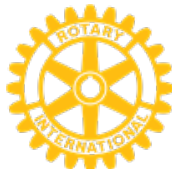
