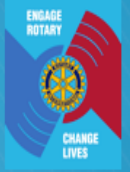

Paul Harris Fellowship

A Paul Harris Fellowship is the recognition the Rotary Foundation gives in appreciation for a donation of US\$ 1,000 to the Annual Fund, PolioPlus or an approved Foundation grant. The recognition consists of a certificate and a pin, an optional medaillon is available for US\$ 15. Multiple donations of US\$ 1,000 receive pins with stones to recognize the specific level of accumulative donation.



Once a Rotarian has donated US\$ 1,000, he or she can recognize someone else with a Paul Harris Fellowship. Rotary clubs can also recognize persons with a Paul Harris Fellowship in appreciation for worthwhile contributions. Paul Harris Fellowship recipients do not necessarily need to be Rotarians; it can be given to anyone. It is also possible to recognize an organization with a donation; if US\$1,000 is donated in the name of an organization the Foundation gives a Certificate of Appreciation instead of a Paul Harris Fellowship. Rotarians who commit to donate at least US\$ 1,000 annually become members of the Paul Harris Society. The Paul Harris Society is administered through the district.

It may appear that there is a lot of emphasis on the recognition given by the Rotary Foundation for donations that result in Paul Harris Fellowships, however it is important to realize that the Foundation gives this recognition in appreciation for a donation. Without donations the

Foundation is not able to give grants, so there would be no Polio Plus, no scholarships, no water projects, no health care projects, no literacy projects and so on. Our club would not have been able to get US\$ 5,000 for LIFE.

Think about it and consider a donation to the Foundation this holiday season. I am not asking for US\$1,000. Any donation you feel comfortable with is welcome.

What the Prez Sees...

Helping Hands and Hearts

Remember Hurricane Ivan?

Even if you don't, I'm certain that your heart is breaking for the Filipino people who lived through the initial nightmare of Typhoon Haiyan and are now facing a daily fight for survival without food or clean water. The images pouring into the media of the death, destruction, and continuing tragedies that follow in the aftermath of such devastation are horrifying and humbling.

RI President Ron Burton made this statement on Facebook, "To help victims of Typhoon Haiyan, I'm urging Rotary clubs to take action to provide emergency aid now and begin planning for the future when we can help rebuild homes, schools, and businesses. We are in the business of helping people in need. Rotary partner ShelterBox has committed aid for 4,000 families in the form of emergency shelter and other relief assistance."

At the 2012 RI Convention, RI President Kalyan Banerjee announced, "In March this year, Rotary International welcomed ShelterBox as our first Rotary project partner. Many of you know about ShelterBox already, and if you don't, well, you should!"

If you aren't familiar with ShelterBox, it's an organization that was launched by Tom Henderson, OBE, a Rotarian and former Royal Navy search and rescue diver, in the Cornish town of Helston. The organization distributes 33"x24"x22" waterproof containers filled with a tent, thermal blankets, insulated ground sheets, mosquito nets, water purification (sufficient for 3 years of use), a basic tool kit, a stove, eating utensils, and even a children's pack with drawing books and crayons.



ShelterBox was launched in 2000 when Rotarian Tom noticed that humanitarian aid often took the

form of food and medicine, but seldom provided families with relief from the elements by providing secure shelter. Since its inception, ShelterBox has established branches in 16 countries around the world and has responded to 200 natural or man-made disasters in 75 countries.

According to Wikipedia, the organization has supplied aid to more than 600,000 people.

One of the ShelterBox branches is in the Philippines, so the organization's volunteers are already on the ground in that country. So far, ShelterBox has committed teams for at least three months and enough aid to help up

to 4,000 people. 504 ShelterBox tents have now arrived in Manila, Philippines. Nearby Bohol Island already has an allocation of 536 boxes and tents, and any that are not needed there will be re-routed to Cebu.

ShelterBox has airlifted 800 tents and boxes into Cebu City airport, with over 500 more on their way by air and sea from Manila. Further stocks are ready and waiting in Dubai, Melbourne and Kuala Lumpur, and more boxes were packed in Cornwall earlier this week.

The Rotary Sunrise International Service Committee has already earmarked \$5000 for our club's contribution to the Philippines relief effort. If you want to personally help increase that amount, please contact Director Pavlov.

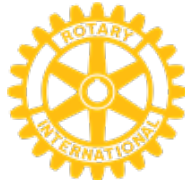
