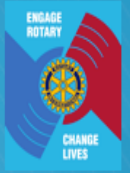

resounding, "Yes!"

Most of the "whys" began by saying, "Because it's our charity."

And that's very true. The Rotary Foundation, while independent from Rotary International, is still administered and directed by Rotarians. The funds poured into TRF go to support local efforts by Rotary clubs all over the world. Even our Sunrise club received \$5000 via District 7020 for our spin-off literacy organization LIFE. That money originated from all of the contributions from Rotarians all over the world giving to TRF.



And yet, 31 of our current roster of 78 active members haven't given even a dollar to the Foundation's annual request for "Every Rotarian, Every Year" (EREY) offering of US\$100 to build the foundation's ability to do

good things in the world.

That's less than \$7 per month in CI dollars that almost half the club can't seem to spare for OUR charity.

On Wednesday, PP Hendrik will be the club's featured speaker to educate us a bit more about The Rotary Foundation and the good things it does in the world. Because we really should be aware of what OUR charity is accomplishing with OUR funds.

So, in preparation for Wednesday's meeting, I echo to you the questions asked by RI President Ron: "Do you donate to The Rotary Foundation? If yes, why? And if no, why not?"

The Rotary Sunrise International Service Committee has already earmarked \$5000 for our club's contribution to the Philippines relief effort. If you want to personally help increase that amount, please contact Director Pavlov.

Each year, Rotary International selects individuals from around the world to receive fully funded academic fellowships at one of our peace centers. These fellowships cover tuition and fees, room and board, round-trip transportation, and all internship/field study expenses. Two types of peace fellowships are available, Master's Degree or a Professional Development Certificate.



Rotary Sunrise is pleased to announce Ms. Danielle Coleman, Disaster Manager for the Cayman Islands Red Cross, has been selected by the Programs and Grants from the Rotary Foundation to attend the summer session of the Rotary Peace Center at Chulalongkorn University in Bangkok, Thailand. This session will run from June 8 to September 2, 2014.

The Professional Development Certificate programme are for those with more extensive experience in peace-related fields, we offer a 3-month program in peace and conflict resolution at Chulalongkorn University in Bangkok, Thailand. This program incorporates 2–3

weeks of field study. We award up to 50 certificates each year.

Stay tuned for more details as the official interview is released.

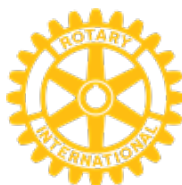
RCGC Meeting Change This Week
