Here's a chance to speak your mind and explain what you believe would be a good way to right some of the wrongs in the world. It's a chance to flesh out ways to make a real difference in the world and have the potential support of Rotary International giving your ideas force and fruition.

Keep in mind that in 1979, Rotary clubs in the Philippines as a community service purchased and delivered polio vaccine to combat the disease in that country. PolioPlus was embraced by Rotary International in 1985 and since that time, the effort has provided polio vaccine to more than 2 billion children around the world.

In 1985, there were 1000 new cases of polio reported every day. 1000 children were being paralyzed by poliovirus every single day. And today, we are on the brink of eradicating that disease from the face of the earth.

In an online video, Past RI President Cliff Dochterman reminisces about how in 1982 he had suggested, "We ought to look forward to Rotary's hundredth anniversary in the year 2005 and maybe we could make a gift to the children of the world by immunizing all the children of the world. Well, I was so naive and so probably ignorant of the magnitude of such a suggestion." But it was a suggestion that took root and grew to be one of Rotary's proudest accomplishments.

So get busy and dream big. Come up with your thoughts of how we as Rotarians can address one of the six areas of focus. Write it up. Send it in. And see how it may change the world.

Health City Cayman Islands Opens February 2014

Health City Cayman Islands, scheduled to accept its first patients in early 2014, will open with a 140-bed tertiary-care hospital in Grand Cayman, as a Center of Excellence in the following areas

- -Cardiac surgery
- -Cardiology
- -Orthopedics

Over the next decade, the hospital will expand to a 2,000-bed facility, and expects to be a JCI (Joint Commission International, USA) Accredited facility providing care in all major specialties including neurology, oncology and other cutting edge tertiary care services. The complex is also planned to have a medical university and an assisted-care living community.

Health City Cayman Islands is the vision of famed India heart surgeon Dr. Devi Shetty. As Chairman of Narayana Health, he oversees a network of 14 hospitals across India. Narayana Health, is joined in the first phase of the project by Ascension Health Alliance, the largest private not for profit health network in the United States.

The Health City Cayman Islands initiative gives the partners the opportunity to positively impact the care being provided in the Caribbean region.

In addition to providing high-quality healthcare to Cayman residents, this initiative also will serve those who are poor and vulnerable by providing them high-quality healthcare services.

Ascension Health Alliance will provide facilities planning, supply chain management and biomedical



engineering services to the project, while Narayana Health will provide technical input and direction to the Cayman team.

The hospital will come up near High Rock in the East End District of Grand Cayman. The first phase would be built by the Cayman Healthcare Construction Group, a joint venture between Caledonia Construction Cayman and healthcare construction specialists Deangelis Diamond Healthcare Group.
