The Establishment of the Cayman Islands Cancer Registry

Dr. Sook Yin spoke to members of Rotary Sunrise on August 19th in regard to the establishment of the Cayman Islands Cancer Registry. Currently neither the Government nor any other agency, including the Cayman Islands Cancer Society, has any data on the incidence and prevalence of cancer in the Cayman Islands. January 2010 is the date which the Cancer Society has set to start gathering information in Cayman on Cancer patients. The information will be available to authorized organizations and persons to assist with the development of oncology services in the Cayman Islands and for planning cancer control programs.

RI Fast Facts—August

- Service Above Self was adopted as an official Rotary motto at the 1950 RI Convention.
- The phrase Service Above Self dates back to the 1911 convention in Portland, Oregon, USA. Paul Harris asked Ben Collins, president of the Rotary Club of Minneapolis, Minnesota, to address the convention after Collins told him that the Minneapolis club had adopted Service, Not Self, as its guiding principle.
- In 2005, Korean districts established a Matching Grant project to plant trees and shrubs in Mongolia as a windbreak against sandstorms that sweep off the Gobi every spring. Since the project's inception, more than a quarter million trees have been planted.

What happens next once the proposal form has been submitted to the Membership Committee?

Once the membership proposal form, bio and resume are received, the Membership Committee will review the information and make a recommendation to the Board for its consideration.

If the Board supports approval of the candidate for membership, the proposal and supporting information is then circulated to the entire membership for consideration which members have seven days within which to object. In the event there is an objection, the Board will then make the final decision.

If there are no objections, the Membership Committee will advise the Sponsor and Candidate and arrange an orientation meeting. Following the orientation meeting, the Club Secretary will arrange for the Prospective Member to be formally inducted and introduced to the Club. He/she will be asked to give his/her job talk at the induction. The Prospective Member may invite family and friends to the induction ceremony.

It is envisaged that if all paperwork is complete and if there are no objections, then the new member should be inducted within 4 weeks of the application being submitted.


