CHAPTER ORGANIZED IN WEST
BEND LAST THURSDAY

Seventeen Rotarians of Hartford
Assist in Organizing—F. W.
Bucklin Chosen President

West Bend is now numbered among the Wisconsin cities which have a Rotary club, a chapter being organized here last Thursday evening with seventeen Hartford Rotarians assisting in the organization. A Rotary club differs from other clubs in that there is only one member representative from each business, profession or manufacturing plant, under certain specified classifications. The club meets once a week, usually at a dinner, where a program is carried out along lines universally adopted by all Rotary clubs. The club will be active in the betterment of business, city and state and will follow a good constructive program. The local organization was sponsored by the Hartford club and was formed following a supper at the Washington House in which local and visiting members participated. The West Bend club will begin with a charter membership of twenty. A charter for the new club is expected in three weeks, following which the presentation meeting will be called.
